DIVERSITY CHAMPION

Our goal is to create a welcoming & inclusive community by assisting the settlement and integration of newcomers, organizing events at the neighbourhood level, and empowering and encourage minority groups to participate fully in community life.

OUR FOOD SENB

Our Food mobilizes community stakeholders to design a long-term strategy that will transition our region's current food system to reflect a community food centre model.

WA ACTION

WA Action works with numerous organizations and individuals throughout Westmorland and Albert counties on a range of projects focusing on transportation, learning and food security.

















PEER SUPPORTED HOUSING

In partnership with UW, Salvus Clinic manages three Peer Supportive Housing buildings, which provide housing with onsite support to tenants who experience issues with mental health and chronic homelessness.

PROVINCIAL COMMUNITY COORDINATOR

In partnership with the provincial government, the Community Coordinator assists in establishing the connection between Clinical Services and community supports to help our young people grow their potential and be all they can be.

INSPIRATION CAFÉ

The Inspiration Café is a full-service café created to address barriers to employment, in particular, mental health. The café is a workplace that provides a supportive environment, while building upon employees' strengths.

FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION

Several local agencies receive free financial administration services provided by our UW.

OUT OF THE COLD EMERGENCY SHELTER

The temporary shelter provides a warm place for people struggling with homelessness in Greater Moncton.
