IMPACT IN ACTION: FOUR-LEGGED SUPERHERO

"Having to testify in court and talking to professionals such as police can be a scary thing to do, especially for children. Children who are victims or witnesses of crime or trauma often must share their story to those working in the justice system. Thanks to the funding provided by the United Way, the Beauséjour Family Crisis Resource Centre is able to offer Marielle, the only Justice Facility Dog in New Brunswick supporting children and vulnerable adults as they navigate the criminal justice system. Marielle is a four-year-old standard poodle trained by the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides to support children as they share their history of trauma, including in the witness box at the Moncton Law Courts. I will never forget the first day that Marielle took the stand with a young victim of sexual assault. During a break she looked at Marielle and said, 'It's like you are my superhero in a red cape. I don't know what I would have done without you.' To put it simply, Marielle helps people when they have seen far too much."

IN 2019, YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE

Building stronger communities by helping kids be all they can be & moving people from poverty to possibility

- 395 youth had access to mental health care from counsellors who understand and who can help teach positive coping skills.
- 139 individuals in poverty were able to participate in the Fresh for Less program, gaining access to fresh fruits and vegetables.
- 4,090 kids had a place to go after school where they could not only learn new skills, but also feel welcomed and appreciated.
- 644 individuals in one rural region experienced an increased standard of living by having basic needs met, learning new skills or becoming employment ready.
- 453 youth gained a better sense of identity and community by participating in indigenous cultural events and activities.



HOW DO WE INVEST?

The Community Investment Committee (CIC) supports United Way's community impact mission by overseeing the strategic investment of resources in our communities. The CIC consists of volunteers from the community who reflect a diversity of experience. The committee reports to the Board of Directors, advising on community investment; informing the Board on emerging community issues revealed through the application review process; and overseeing investment and United Way strategy alignment.
